



Furrow

Yarn: Aran weight.

I used five colours of Little Houndales Suffolk X with 50% Alpaca and two New Lanark Donegal Aran Silk

Needles: 5.5 mm

Finished Size: 88 inches, but the sky is the limit!

Pattern notes:

This scarf is so named as the 1X1 ribbing - knitting the knit stitches through the back loop - reminds me of ploughed fields.

By changing the rib pattern with each colour the effect is reminiscent of squares which have been sewn together in a shabby chic, rustic manner.

You can have a lot of fun experimenting with colours, differing square sizes, different stitches and textures.

I adore the snugly softness of the Little Houndales Alpaca/Wool mix and the tweedy, silk texture of the New Lanark and the colours are oh, so autumn!



Stitches:

Knit in 1 x 1 rib

Sl—Slip stitch

KTBL—Knit through the back loop

P—Purl

Cast on 40 stitches with your preferred method.

Square one ~ Sl1, *KTBL, P
Repeat from * across the row

Continue to work rows in 1x1 rib, slipping the first stitch until you have knitted 6 inches.

Change to your next chosen colour.

Square 2 ~ Sl1, *P, KTBL
Repeat from * to end of the row

Continue to work 1x1 rib pattern until you have knitted a further 6 inches

Change to your next chosen colour and resume pattern for Square one.

Once you have knitted another 6 inches of colour, change again and resume rib pattern for square 2.

Carry on alternating between square 1 and 2 until your scarf is your desired length.

Bind off.
